Programme notes

We have chosen a set of pieces that are more relaxing and restful today. Go to sleep if you wish, but don't snore too loudly!

John Rutter's choral pieces, always expressive, are ideal choices, as are the two Fauré pieces, one choral, one for cello. Fauré was only a teenager when he won a prize for his Cantique. His Élégie, however, is a mature work, written in 1880, and is dedicated to the cellist Jules Loeb, who gave its first performance in 1883. Fauré's teacher, Saint-Saens, is represented here by *The Swan*, with Jill Cooper on cello. Jill is also featured in César Franck's well-known Panis Angelicus.

The rest of the programme is made up of more recent compositions, from the popular music scene, and from the contemporary classical choral repertoire. Ole Gjeilo's Ubi Caritas and Eric Whitacre's Seal Lullaby are both evocative in their own way. Ubi Caritas creates a hypnotic medieval monastery atmosphere, whilst Seal Lullaby (words by Rudyard Kipling), creates a gentle musical picture of protective ocean waves,. New Zealand born David Hamilton's May The Road Rise To Meet You is a lovely version of the Irish Blessing.

Selected because of their relaxed and expressive qualities, songs such as Leonard Cohen's Hallelujah, What a Wonderful World, and Mortensen's Since You Went Away, are obvious inclusions in this programme, and Thank You For The Music (thank you, ABBA!), reminds us that we should thank our creator for giving us music in the first place!
